



The Aven de la Barelle is a great classic cavity in the landscape of the Grands Causses. It is known for its extremely photogenic wells. The entrance to this cavity is a huge sinkhole that opens to the sky. Three magnificent wells await you. They are cut by the passage of water.






The Causse Méjean is a high plain. Its vegetation is particular with the breeding of the sheep. Not far from the entrance you will also see the wild horses of Prjevalski









Castelbouc N°1 is a small vertical traverse. Three parallel wells will be equipped to offer you several points of view. The river part is also very interesting and is visible above the wells.

Castelbouc N°4 is very different. It is a cavity with large volumes. She is world famous for these sauropod dinosaur footprints. Several rooms are to be photographed. We advise you to photograph the Tunnel, the gallery of sands and the chouquet siphon which marks the terminus of the cavity. These parts can be photographed without excess flashes.







# Tantayrou river

This underground river located near Chanac is very suitable for underground photography. The entrance is a five minute walk away. It consists of a narrow passage of a few meters leading to a step. The river is right there. It is the atmosphere of an underground river that is found only at very great depth. He's a big collector. The scenery is incredible, the jagged rocks, there are lots of little siphons, deep water that is always clear.

Photographs can be taken at the same location. There is a lot of possible framing.










# LANDSCAPE


Malaval réseau des Blanches et des Super-Blanches


#### **LANDSCAPE**


The Tucs Gallery is a jewel of the Malaval Underground River. its access is sporty and very airy. It is after climbing 30 meters that we enter this imposing gallery. It is covered with agaonite stalactites, columns, and unique speleothems. the gallery extends later in a more conventional form with very straight and very graphic walls. Some strata show some dinosaur footprints.





The Rabiné Aven is a vertical cavity composed of an entrance leading quickly above a 60m deep well. This well is extremely photogenic. the Aven du Baoumas is right next to it, a team of speleologists is currently making the connection. The junction may be made on the day of the SPM2022 event. The equipment is currently in place. If speleologists are interested in this cavity they will be able to discover it. the Rabiné and Baoumas sinkholes are optional cavities




The Rabiné sinkhole opens onto the crests of the Causse de Sauveterre overlooking the Tarn gorges. The village of Saint Rome de Dolan is just next door as the sublime point, exceptional belvedere on the Tarn




The loss of Bonheur (Bonheur = hapiness is name of the river that flows on the surface) crosses the limestone massif to emerge at its foot. Edouard Alfred Martel and his team were the first to make the crossing equipped with a boat and a ladder. This underground river is as historic as it is beautiful. It is a real canyon with galleries several dozen meters high that you will discover. Water is everywhere. The entrance and the exit are two extremely photogenic points.




The cavity has been fitted out for the visit to tourism. It is a very busy place in the middle of the summer season, renowned for the beauty of its landscapes. we will let you judge













The visit of the Aven Armand remains an unforgettable memory. You will access it by the natural entrance and its well leading into the large room. Chills guaranteed. For two hours you will have the privilege of photographing the stalagmite forest by the light of your headlamps. Then you will have the opportunity to photograph the entrance shaft or the terminal shaft. The ascent will be done with the funicular and its inclined tunnel. After the meal break on site, you will benefit from an accompaniment towards photogenic cave entrances.

No known cave in the world has anything similar," wrote Edouard-Alfred Martel in front of the forest of 400 stalagmites of Aven Armand.




Discovered at the end of autumn 1880 by Sahuquet, a young shepherd then in pursuit of a fox, it was not until 1888 that the speleologist Édouard-Alfred Martel made a complete exploration. It was fitted out and opened to the public in 1890. It was the first cavity in France to open to the public.

This cavity is composed of an entrance which opens onto a vast room where stalagmites of very varied colors grow. In the extension of this room you will find smaller and very photogenic volumes. The suite is accessible by a staircase that plunges into the depths where everything becomes marvels: stone waterfalls, stalactites, gours...




## LANDSCAPE

The Dargilan cave is a veritable balcony over the Jonte gorges. Located on the Causse Noir, you will see the impregnable cliffs of the Causse Mejean



The Mas raynal is a spectacular sinkhole with its great vertical of 100m. Its walls are always green and during the day the fog appears with the sun. This picturesque site is the farthest from Chanac. It takes a 1h20 drive. A local caving team is waiting for you to make you live a vertiginous moment.
